Hartnell will host Juneteenth Celebration June 18 in Central Plaza

The Second Annual Salinas Juneteenth Celebration, a community-wide cultural event to commemorate the liberation of enslaved African and Black American people in 1865, will be held at Hartnell from 12-6 p.m. on June 18.

The celebration of this newly recognized national holiday will feature live music, activities for children, food, vendors and a fashion show, all intended to highlight and honor Black history, culture and pride.

Yvonne Thomas, president of NAACP Monterey County, will give welcoming remarks at 1:10 p.m., followed by greetings from

Chris Barrera, president of Salinas LULAC Council #2055. Live entertainment will include performances by the New Hope Baptist Church youth choir, African drumming and poetry, as well as a DJ.

The event planning committee includes 2020 Hartnell graduate Kenya Burton, a community organizer and the Youth Poet Laureate for Salinas who now attends Sacramento State



University. In her biography on the event website, she said she joined the Juneteenth team to "shine a light on the people that are often forgotten and to bring hope to Salinas."

"I hope to continue to organize and make sure that celebrations like this continue for years to come," she said.

Juneteenth marks June 19, 1865, the day Union soldiers enforced President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation and freed all remaining slaves in Texas, signaling the full enactment of that decree.

Erica Padilla-Chavez, president of the Hartnell Community College District, said Hartnell is proud to host Salinas' second annual Juneteenth and grateful for the opportunity to be a part of such a meaningful celebration.

Hartnell HEP students receive national HEP/CAMP scholarship





Two of the 2022 graduates from Hartnell's High School Equivalency Program (HEP) have received \$1,000 scholarships from the HEP/CAMP National Association to continue their studies at Hartnell. The recipients are Bonifacia Bautista and Erick Gonzalez Soto, both of Salinas.

Bautista, who completed her HEP studies while also working in the strawberry fields, has continued her studies this spring in English as a Second Language classes. She holds a Hartnell HEP record for having attended the most tutoring hours (201) in addition to her class hours.

Soto, who plans to continue his studies in construction or advanced automotive technology, attended morning classes after finishing work at 4 a.m. at a local agricultural packing facility. He also was selected as a Fall 2021 recipient of the Dr. Topete Scholarship through the Hartnell College Foundation.

The National HEP/CAMP Association is made up of universities, colleges and non-profit organizations that administer high school equivalency or a College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP).

Financial aid staff hold labs in Salinas and King City

With the approach of June 30 deadline to complete the FAFSA for the preceding 2021-22 academic year, the Hartnell Financial Aid office continues to hold a series of labs each Monday on the Main Campus and on specific dates at the Alisal Campus and the King City Education Center.

FAFSA and Dream Act Submission Labs

In addition to the weekly Monday labs from 3-4:30 p.m. on Main Campus, the next Alisal

Campus lab will be from 3:30-5 p.m. on July 18, and the next King City lab will be from 2:30-4:30 p.m. on July 18. The Main Campus labs are held in the Student Services Building, room B-110, the Alisal Campus labs are held in AC-213 and the King City labs are held in room 109. Staff will provide assistance to students and their parents seeking help with FAFSA and California Dream Act applications.

Although participation has been modest in recent weeks, Financial Aid Director Jessica Tovar expects activity to pick up. "As students are getting word that we are now offering these labs, they're coming in to get the help they need," she said.

To prepare for the workshop, be sure to bring a driver's license and Social Security card or Alien Registration Card (if applicable) as well as student and parent W-2s and taxes for 2020, records of asset value and schools under consideration.

The children crossed a "bridge" from center staff to their parents and were then presented a medallion and certificate.


